

MINUTES SUBJECT TO APPROVAL AT THE MAY 21, 2024 COUNCIL MEETING.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY REPORT CONTINUED.



The afternoon session included the Bishop's Report where Bishop Lorna announced she would not stand (be a part of the voting process) for bishop at the 2025 Synod Assembly. Elections for various committees and delegates to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix were held. There were only two resolutions and both passed. The first was the 2025 Synod Compensation and Care Guidelines which was amended to increase the pulpit supply rate. The second resolution was to adopt the 2024 and 2025 synod budgets. The assembly closed with the installation of the Synod Council and prayer.

Assembly offerings totaling almost \$21,000 will be distributed to two ministries -1.) Help with registration and transportation expenses of youth going to the National Youth Gathering (75%) and, 2.) the Western Iowa Synod Hog Project (25%) which provides Iowa pork to community pantries in the Western Iowa Synod. The Synod asked for \$450 from each congregation and Bethany's offering was \$513 garnered from Lenten meal offerings.

[NOTE: "Clay County Food for Life" is the local non-profit providing meat to people in need and it works closely with UDMO which distributes the meat. The address for CCFFL is PO Box 126, Spencer IA 51301. If you have any questions, Denise can help.]

A goal for the 2025 Synod Assembly would be to have greater representation from Bethany Lutheran by sending additional delegates – (1) a young adult, age 19-30; and (2) a youth (confirmed 18 and under).

A copy of a special edition of WATERLIFE JOURNAL is available in the narthex (one page synopsis of assembly). The monthly WATERLIFE JOURNAL (an online flip-magazine) is delivered via email from the synod. If you would like to be on that mailing list, please tell Elizabeth in Bethany's office.

Kristin and Denise were Bethany's voting lay delegates. Rostered leaders also attending were Rev. Rosenkvist and Rev. Mechler.



FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK ... updates on what the Council is working on.

Good News! The new roof on the Welcome Center is done and no more leaks!

The north door camera has been installed and is working. This comes with new security protocols at Bethany. All doors in the church will remain locked. When you come to the north door, push the button on the camera and Elizabeth will let you in.

The first draft of a new personnel policy at Bethany providing sabbatical leave for rostered ministers was reviewed. This employment benefit has not been offered before at Bethany and was seen as a possible enticement for future ministerial staff. It demonstrates Bethany's commitment to the well-being of staff during continuous service, along with the congregation's desire to also learn and grow through the sabbatical process. The Council continues to work on strategic long-range planning for Bethany Lutheran. Down the road, we will need congregation participation to get things started – watch for more details.

We are also working on being more intentional in doing all the things the constitution says the council will do.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY REPORT DENISE KRAMER TOLZMANN AND KRISTIN BENSON

The Western Iowa Synod is one of 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The Synod Assembly is a combination business meeting/worship/convention/training held annually; this year at three locations in Council Bluffs April 19-20 and over 200 people attended, representing the 115 congregations in Western Iowa.

The theme for this year's assembly was – "Stir Us Up to Be – Brave, Authentic, Free, Disruptive Disciples" – and the theme was depicted with spoons. Watch for utilization of spoons "stirring us up" at Bethany in the days and weeks to come!

Friday afternoon's pre-assembly session was led by Rev. Paul Erbes, a long-time ELCA minister across the country now serving as Vice President of Advancement & Fundraising at Morningside University. The first half of his presentation was on "God's Economy" – the purpose of which is LOVE (love God; love neighbor). Many Biblical references pointed us to being (1) responsible stewards – taking care of stuff; (2) faithful stewards – taking care of God's stuff; and (3) evangelical stewards – taking care of God's plan. The program continued with fundraising in congregations (the core concepts, giving sources, practical tools – many great opportunities for stewardship!).

The Synod's fall 2023 fundraiser for food relief was a barbecue challenge. The winner prepared the evening community meal of smoked pork Friday evening. A three-hour assembly opening and worship followed. Congregational and individual anniversaries were recognized. Notable anniversaries around Spencer include the 75th Anniversary of Drive-In Worship at First Lutheran in Milford (the oldest continuous drive-in worship in the country!). Also, Rev. Peter Morlock (Bethany/Emmetsburg & Lost Island/Ruthven) was recognized for 30 years of rostered Word & Sacrament ministry and Deacon Lynn Egesdal for 10 years of rostered Word & Service ministry.

"God's Work, Our Hands" is scheduled for September 8, 2024 and this is the ten-year anniversary. The ELCA's World Hunger program is fifty years old.

The beautiful worship service music was led by a young people's choir. A short clip was posted on Bethany's Facebook page ("All Are Welcome"). Kristin liked the processional and utilization of streamers that seemed to represent the Holy Spirit. Denise enjoyed singing with the over 200 Lutherans worshiping - the sound was almost angelic! The evening's message was delivered by Vicar Paige McGrath from Sioux City – stirring us to recognize that disruption brings new life. She encouraged all to be their brave, authentic self – even if it's disruptive.

Saturday morning's keynote address was light-hearted and honestly delivered by Methodist minister Rev. Debra McKnight, the founding pastor of 'Urban Abbey' in Omaha (theurbanabbey.org). She stirred us to be aware of the Spirit moving and ministering in our communities. She encouraged us to develop a year-round plan of action ("Fail to plan – plan to fail") based on everything happening in community; then thinking about what makes sense to celebrate in worship. "Get over yourself ... Look to the future." "Presence over programs."

We invite you to share a geranium to decorate the sanctuary on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th. You may take them home after the service



The racing green leather couch in the pastor's study, of my childhood, was wonderful to sit on. I played with Hot Wheels there. I sometimes sat on it waiting for my father to finish his head usher duties or council meetings with Pastor Ralph.

Dad was permitted to climb stairs to the sacristy. I wasn't. I was too young. The steps were steep. Nearly 90 degrees. It was a Vincent Van Gogh type of room (just big enough for a cot and chair, plus a tiny window). I would be allowed to enter the sacristy after my Confirmation Day. Until then the green couch befriended me. No T.V. No Wi-fi. This was between 1963 to 1971.

That sacristy had an interesting history. During one chapter of life an organist would sleep in the sacristy. His other job was being our church janitor and playwright. Once he did a one man show about Vincent Van Gogh on Off-Broadway. I think the sacristy inspired him more than the Dutch paintings.

I admit, I once snooped around the pastor's study. Not my finest moment. I checked out the pastor's closet. The robes were all black. I tried one on. Checked myself out in his mirror. Dad reprimanded me as a father ought. Said to me, "One day you'll have your own office." And a green couch, I asked? He made no promises. Before dad died he heard me preach once; the Sunday after ordination. He told me I needed to study more and in the meantime to purchase some good sermons. Study them, he meant.

Dad never saw me in a pastor's study. I could tell him: people who have no restraint do snoop on the pastor's things. Many church offices and parsonages are neglected. I've known cold winters with a space heater, where even cross ventilation was nonexistent. That has not been the case in either Bethlehem or Bethany. One pastor room I was given (years back) existed in a church basement. It had no windows. The furniture was left over garage sale items that never sold. Two chairs and a steal table. It was hoped the pastor would leave. The pastor did. And no pastor to this day has taken a call there. The pastor's study is certainly a reflection of the congregation and not just the pastor.

I know pastors can get derailed or distracted from study time. To preach faithfully, and to administer the sacraments purposely, caringly, and to teach classes well, takes study and prayer time. May call committees remember to discuss hospitality and study time with candidates. After installation be sure to check out your pastor's office. Like phones, and doors, appointments work in two directions as well. You may always make an appointment to see your pastor. Don't wait or assume the pastor will call on you.

After my confirmation day the pastor moved on as did his green couch. Upon my retirement I'll get my leather chair. Maybe racing green. Maybe.
